- Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of the entry and continue to be so up to and including the day of the show.
- The Veterinary Surgeons shall be empowered to expel from the Showground any equine, which, is suffering from or affected by any contagious or infectious disease likely to prove harmful to other equines, or any equine which in their opinion is unfit for exhibition. The Veterinary Surgeons shall issue a certificate recording their findings.
- In accordance with the Health and Safety Legislation's all equestrian exhibitors/competitors/grooms must now comply with the above. Total separation between equines and the public may in certain instances be impossible and it is suggested that if any exhibitor has a nervous/highly strung equine he/she should consider whether it is prudent for him/her to risk bringing this animal to the showground. Children should not be allowed to manage any large or fractious animal. An adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty maintaining control of any animal.

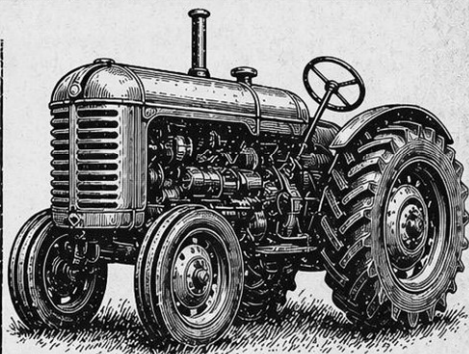

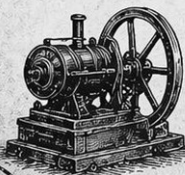

RECIPE FOR CLASS 12

Soda Bread (Makes 2 x 1lb Loaves)

Ingredients

- 250g whole wheat flour
- 200g plain flour
- 50g porridge oats (optional, for decoration)
- 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 350ml buttermilk *or* 350ml milk mixed with 2 tablespoons lemon juice or vinegar.
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon honey, syrup, or sugar
- Optional: seeds for topping

Method

1. In a large bowl, sieve together the plain flour, bicarbonate of soda, baking powder, and salt. Stir in the whole wheat flour.
2. Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients. Add the egg, honey (or syrup/sugar), and buttermilk.
3. Mix until you have a soft but firm dough. Do not overmix.
4. Divide the dough evenly between the loaf tins and shape gently.
5. Air fry 160°C for 20 minutes, turning halfway through after 10 minutes.
6. Once baked, remove from the tins and cool under a clean tea towel to soften the crust.

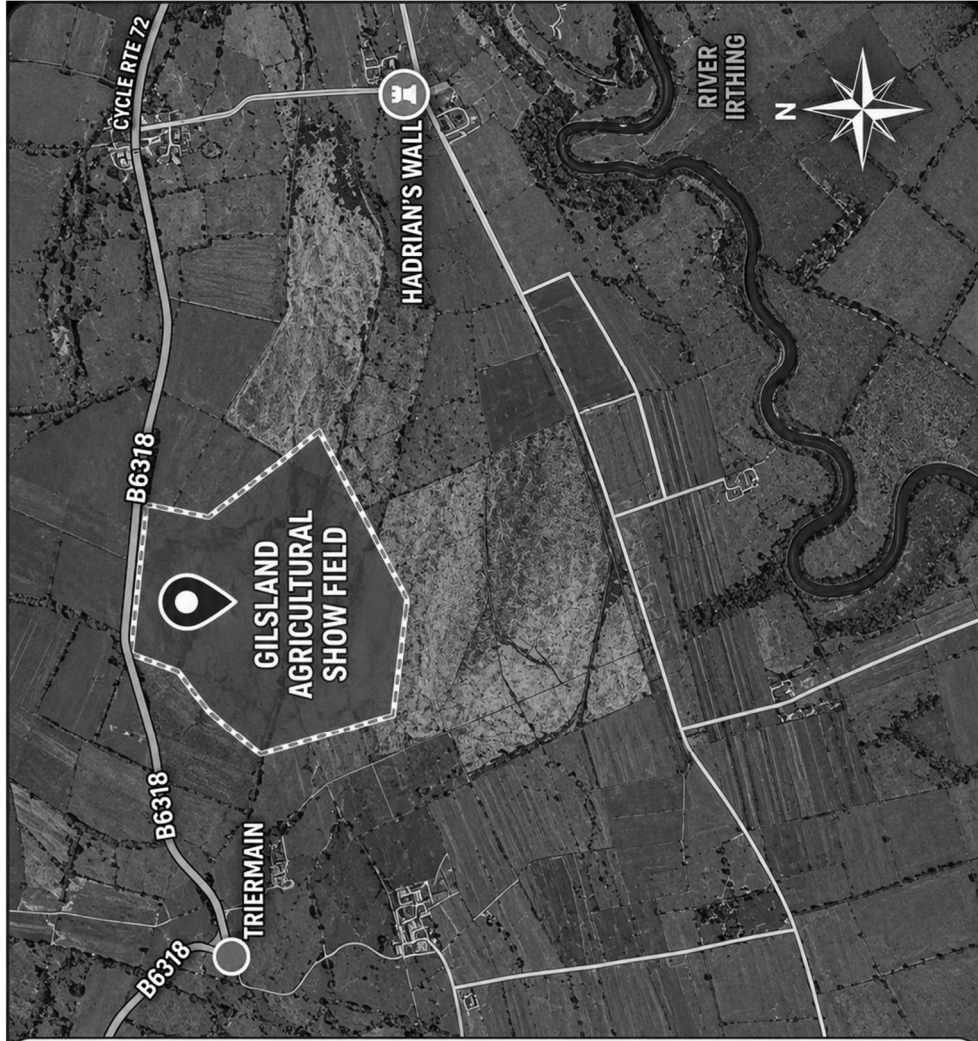
