- Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of the entry and continue to be so up to and including the day of the show.
- The Veterinary Surgeons shall be empowered to expel from the Showground any equine, which in their opinion, is suffering from or affected by any contagious or infectious disease likely to prove harmful to other equines, or any equine which in their opinion is unfit for exhibition. The Veterinary Surgeons shall issue a certificate recording their findings.
- In accordance with the Health and Safety Legislation's all equestrian exhibitors/competitors/grooms must now comply with the above. Total separation between equines and the general public may in certain instances be impossible and it is suggested that if any exhibitor has a nervous/highly strung equine he/she should consider whether it is prudent for him/her to risk bringing this animal to the showground. Children should not be allowed to handle any large or fractious animal. An adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty maintaining control of any animal.

All work must be that of the exhibitor.

All prize winning articles of the previous years are debarred.

The Committee do not hold themselves responsible for the loss, damage or Detention of exhibits but every care will be taken.

Each article to be staged between 9.30 and 10.30am.

Judging to commence at 11.00am

No goods may be removed before 4.00pm. Any article remaining after 4.15pm will be at owner's risk.

Official doyleys are supplied for the Homebaking classes and no others will be accepted.

Judges will award First, Second & third prizes in each class unless the exhibit is not in accordance with the schedule. In classes with a low number of entries, prizes will be awarded at the judges' discretion.

Points awarded in all sections are 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point. Should a tie be awarded for 1st prize, exhibitors will receive 3 points each but no 2nd prize will be awarded. Should a tie occur for 2nd prize, exhibitors will receive 2 points each but no 3rd prize will be awarded. Should a tie occur for 3rd prize exhibitors will receive 1 point each.
